Gospel Reflection

'The key word today is 'hear'. It is a very scriptural word and contains essentially four elements:

- to *listen* with a totally open and unconditional mind ("Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God")
- to *understand* what one hears
- to *accept and appropriate fully* what one understands and, finally,
- this acceptance *flows out into our behaviour.*

One can listen but not understand and one can understand without accepting and one can accept without implementing.

All four are necessary for conversion and healing. All four are necessary for full hearing.'

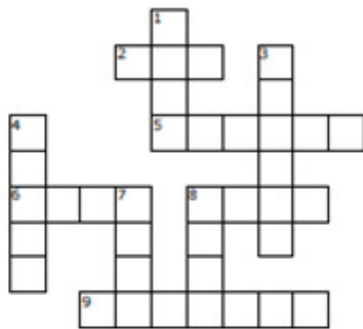
