**GOSPEL REFLECTION**

The people in today's Gospel reading had come to Jesus with mixed motives: They were looking for a spectacle, for entertainment, for food. But what they were offered was not temporary nourishment - they were offered a relationship with the Creator of all that is temporary and all that is eternal, through Jesus Christ his Son, the Bread of life, in whom whoever believes will never be hungry, and through whom all are offered eternal life.

As we come to share in the Eucharist, and to partake of Jesus, the Bread of life, we, too, may come with mixed motives: but we are offered no less than those to whom Jesus spoke in today's Gospel. We are offered not temporary nourishment, but the food which sustains us on our Christian journey to eternal life; we are offered not a quick fix for our problems, but a relationship with the Source of all life; we are not offered a piece of ordinary bread, but Jesus himself, the Bread of life, who loves us, forgives our sins, and gives us food that endures to eternal life.

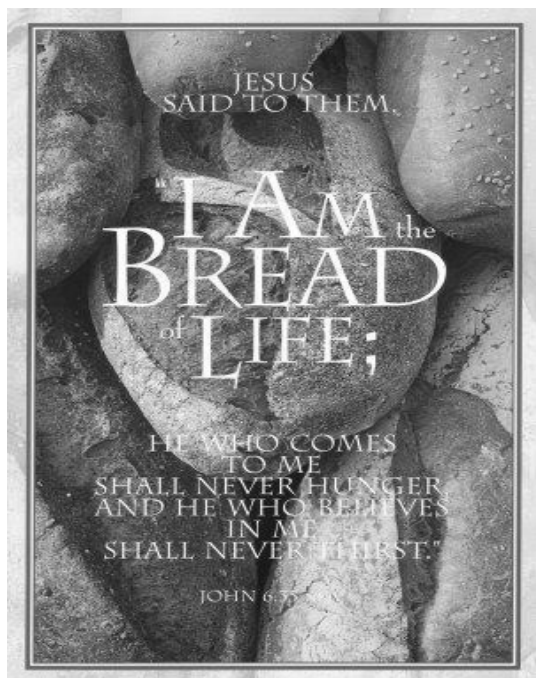

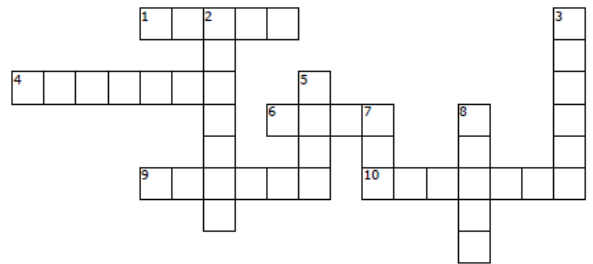

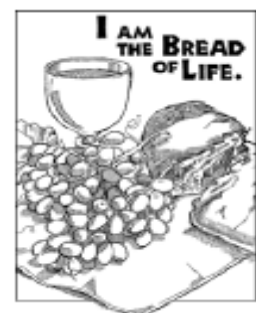
